SUMMER SCHOOL

Riverside Brookfield High School offers summer school in a limited number of subjects. Each course is taught according to the same curriculum offered during the normal school year. All classes are subject to sufficient enrollment.

Enrollment numbers will cancel classes or dictate that we offer additional classes.

REGISTRATION: March 17 – May 22 for all courses in the Business Office.

Registration forms are available in the Business Office.

Driver's Education Registration is May 7, 2009 at 6:00 p.m. in Room 187 or the Athletic Office after May 7.

FEES: All tuition and fees must be paid at the time of registration. Fees are \$150 per semester course and \$290 for two semester courses. Fees for driver education and enrichment classes are listed in the course descriptions.

REFUNDS: If the section is not offered due to insufficient enrollment or staff availability, a refund will be given. No other refunds will be extended. If a student has to be removed from class for any reason, no refund will be issued.

SUMMER SCHOOL PROCEDURES

ATTENDANCE: If a student is unable to attend summer school classes because of illness or an emergency, the parent must report the absence and its reason by 9 a.m. to the Attendance Office, 442-7500 ext. 191. Messages may be recorded on an answering machine during the hours the office is closed (non-business hours). Students are not to arrive more than 15 minutes before class time. If they do, they should wait in the main lobby. All students are to be out of the building within 15 minutes of the end of class unless they are under the direct supervision of an instructor or coach.

Because of the intensified nature of the summer school program, absences reduce a student's chance for success since the work covered each day equals that covered in six regular school days. *A student attending summer school may not accrue more than one absence due to illness or emergency. A family vacation is not an acceptable excuse for an absence.* No incompletes will be given. A student will be dropped with a "W" under the following conditions:

- a. Any unexcused absences
- b. Exceed one (1) excused absence per semester
- c. Tardiness to class more than two times per semester
- d. Not returning to class from any scheduled class break will count as an absence.

DISCIPLINE: Failure to behave in an appropriate manner may subject the student to disciplinary action or dismissal from the summer program without a tuition refund or class credit. School policies in effect during the normal school year also apply during summer school.

TRANSPORTATION: Students are expected to provide their own transportation and if they drive they need to address their own parking arrangements. There will be limited parking on Rockefeller Road. Please check the appropriate box on the

registration form if you are requesting parking. You will be notified prior to the start of class as to whether you receive a parking pass. Permits are required in all lots.

BICYCLES: Chain bikes ONLY to bike racks. We strongly recommend locking up your bike with a U-lock rather than a chain.

SPORTS CAMPS: Students in summer school may participate in camps, but only if such participation does not impact their daily and complete attendance in their summer school classes. RB believes in students with diverse interests; however, academics must always come first.

CREDIT COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Fine Arts Survey

.5 credit

June 15 - July 7

Monday-Friday

8:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.

Fee: \$150 + \$25 lab fee

Location: Hollywood School

This required course will satisfy the first ½ of the one-credit minimum Fine Arts graduation requirement. This broad survey of the Fine Arts will expose students to the societal/cultural influences and impact of the Fine Arts throughout history. Elements, principles, concepts, and vocabulary will be introduced, along with basic processes and tools, giving students the means to respond to the artistic expression of others in the areas of art, music, dance, and drama. The unique characteristics of each of the four Fine Arts will be discussed within the framework of their interrelationships.

Health Education

.5 credit

June 15 - July 7

Monday-Friday

8:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.

Fee: \$150

Location: Hollywood School

This required class is open to current sophomores, and juniors/seniors who failed. Health Education concentrates on wellness rather than illness. Units dealing with mental health, relationships, nutrition and fitness give students information which allows them to build self-esteem, life skills and responsible decision-making skills. Also covers critical issues of our time, i.e. drug abuse, cardiovascular diseases, teen suicide and cancer.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS SEMINAR

FRESHMAN Academic Success Seminar

.5 credit

This class is designed for incoming RB 9th graders. An individualized learning plan will be developed for all students taking this course so that course content addresses specific needs of each learner. The goal is to prepare students for maximum success by developing organizational skills and introducing them to their fall Math, English and Advanced Reading courses, with special focus on reading and critical thinking skills. 95% attendance will earn a tuition rebate of \$75.

Summer Driver Education registration will take place Thursday, May 7th in room 187 at 6:00 p.m. At that time any student planning to take summer school driver education (any phase) may sign up for classes.

Requirements are:

Must be 15 years of age by June 8th; must live in RBHS district; must have passed 8 classes the last 2 semesters; and must have completed freshman year.

Applications will be provided at registration. Registration will be done in chronological order according to birth date. Checks should be made payable to RBHS and must be submitted at the time of registration. If you are registering for a behind-the-wheel class you must have your driver's permit WITH YOU or departmental approval at the time of registration. 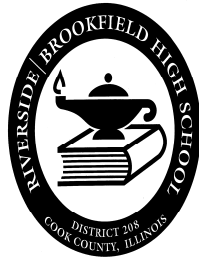
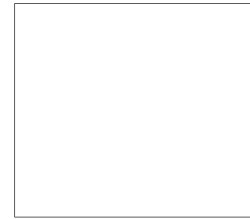
