### THE COMMUNITY

Riverside Brookfield High School is located just 13 miles west of Chicago in a predominantly residential suburb designed by Frederick Law Olmstead. Students attending RBHS come primarily from Riverside, North Riverside and Brookfield. Residents of these communities are largely professional, semiprofessional, managerial, proprietary and skilled workers. The community passed a \$58 million referendum to expand and renovate the school building which is currently in its third phase of construction and was substantially completed in September of 2009.

### THE SCHOOL

A total of 80% of the 119 professional personnel hold a master's degree or beyond. The school year consists of two semesters, with the first ending January 22, 2010 and the second ending June 11, 2010. Classes meet five days a week and earn one-half credit each. Students must carry a minimum of five classes and may take up to seven during the regular school day. When offered, summer school sessions are three weeks each. The mean academic class size is 21.5:1. The student to regular teaching faculty ratio is 18:1. The student to all certified staff ratio is 12.9:1. The average pupil expenditure in 2008-2009 was \$15,549. Recent curricular innovations: The School of Environmental Education, academic support teams, Professional Learning Communities and a school/college partnership agreement with Triton community college.

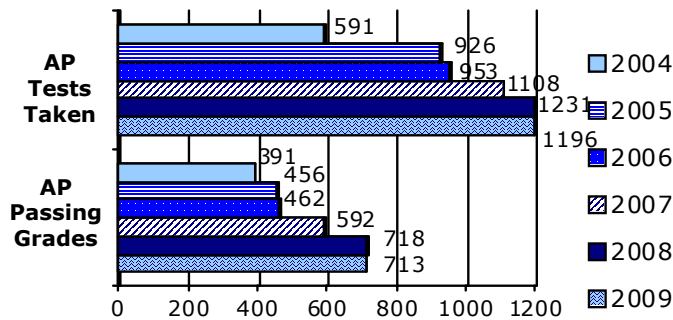

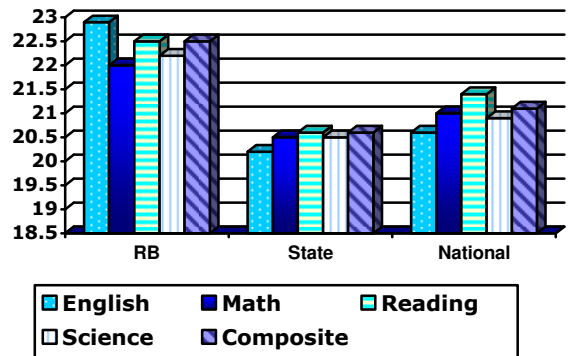

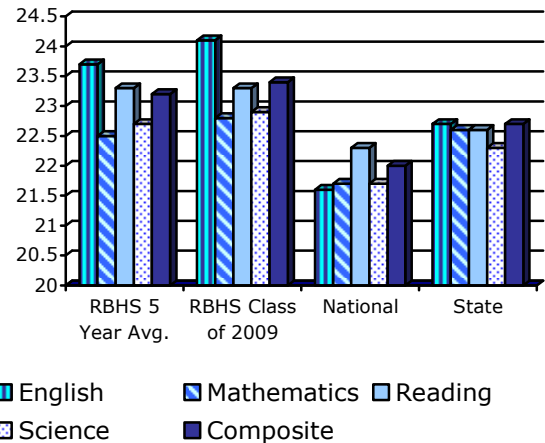
